# And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" --Luke 1:46-47

Dear friends in Christ,

One of the reasons Christmastime is a favorite season for me is that it seems easier to get others to join me in seeking out moments of joy. From hearing favorite Christmas carols to twinkling Christmas lights it is as if there is a conspiracy to find joy around every corner.

The two verses quoted from the Gospel of Luke above are the beginning of Mary's song of praise, also known as the Magnificat. Mary sings this song of praise while visiting Elizabeth and Elizabeth greeted her with praise and blessing declaring: "as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy" (Luke 1:44; that leaping child would become known as John the Baptist). It is all about praise and joy, and that praise and joy came right in the middle of overwhelming challenges for Mary.

Mary sings this song of praise to God even though at the time her family and likely her entire village were not present for the angel Gabriel's announcement, and so it was natural for Mary to flee to an older relative (Elizabeth) not only to confirm that Elizabeth was also having a special baby as Mary had been told by the Angel Gabriel, but also to receive the comfort she so needed from her relative Elizabeth.

Comfort and joy!!

Comfort and joy are two things we commonly seek as well.

I wonder if this is one of the reasons The Magnificat has been one of my very favorite scripture passages. I also love the many many songs based on this scripture passage, including *Canticle of the Turning* (My soul cries out), *Magnificat*, and other newer praise songs inspired by this beautiful song Mary sings from her heart. Next time you are looking for words to praise God, I encourage you to look to Luke 1:46-55 for inspiration.

And as we continue to look for God's presence, including in the most unexpected place, may we find joy upon joy even in the midst of life's challenges. To encourage us to look for God in unexpected places and honor both the challenges and joys, we'll continue to use Kate Bowler's resources to bless the Advent we actually have rather than painting images that do not exist in our realities this season.

I hope and pray that you find both comfort and joy this season, including at our various special worship services and other events. Peace, comfort and joy to you as we prepare to celebrate Christ Jesus' birth.


What Is Advent?

Advent means "arrival" and signifies the start of an event or the arrival of a person. Advent is a season in the Church calendar dedicated to the hopeful anticipation for the arrival or "advent" of Jesus of Nazareth. During the four-week period leading up to Christmas, many Advent observers engage in prayer, meditation, and Scripture study that emphasizes hope, peace, love, and joy. Christians from many backgrounds celebrate this time, and while their practices may look different, all focus on the hope-filled arrival of Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah and King.
